TO SUPPLY MATZOTH FREE.

Jewish Charitable Organizations Will Assist the Needy.

Jewish charitable organizations have perfected plans whereby no needy person will have to go without matzoth, or unleavened bread, during the celebration of the Feast of the Passover, beginning on the night of April 14 and extending through April 22. New York organizations will supply matzoth even to refugees in Japan, according to an announcement made yesterday by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society of America at 279 East Broadway.

In New York City the Maskel El Dol Society begins today the distribution of 50,000 pounds of matzoth among the needy in Manhattan and the Bronx.

"No needy person will be without matzoth," said Jacob Reit, Secretary of the society, yesterday. "We are going to give away 50,000 pounds, beginning tomorrow, and we will see that every one gets a share. Notwithstanding high prices, there will be no shortage for the holidays. We are also distributing tea and sugar and at least 3,000 pounds of meat for the occasion."

Matzoth this year, like everything else, has risen in price, costing six cents a pound more on the average than ever before. It was the rise in cost that led the charitable organizations to act.
