areas we have already received word that the supplies have arrived. All  
should be at their destinations in ample time for distribution before the  
holiday.

In addition to providing the standard items as matzoh, wine, haGgadahs,  
which supplementary food for sedarim and for observation men for the entire  
week. In some instances we have even provided paper cups, plates, etc. to  
ensure a perfectly kosher sedar. We have further sent cash advances to  
chaplains for the purpose of purchasing kosher foods themselves.  
In addition to what we have sent, the Women's Division has sent in  
bulk to the various theaters Passover packages in large quantities.  
In addition to the J.B. haGgadahs we have made available to chalalans  
in small quantities other haGgadahs. We have a file of ex-chaplains and  
rabbits who are ready to conduct sedarim where no regularly assigned  
chalalans are available. So far the requests have been few, and it has  
been possible to assign some or separated chaplains to them. No  
chaplains will be assigned as long as ex-chaplains are available.

TO REPRESENTATIVES OF THE JEWISH WELFARE BOARD:

May I first of all express the appreciation of the Jewish Welfare Board for all you and your associates have done to facilitate Passover arrangements for the men in the service. Some of you have been called on to help see to it that men who could be spared would be granted the furloughs authorized by the War and Navy Departments to enable them to spend Passover with their families. Others of our loyal workers have had the more difficult task of providing for the men who could now go home by arranging for hospitality in the communities nearest to the camps. The reports that we have received indicate that the Jewish communities are everywhere responding, in generous measure, to the opportunity of looking after the men in the service. Our field workers have been tireless in their efforts and our national staff has labored effectively to meet all the needs for Passover arrangements.

For all this effort, we are deeply grateful.

May I ask you to convey also to the soldiers and sailors who are your guests, the Passover greetings of the Jewish Welfare Board. Whether they are about to go home on furlough, or will be attending Seders and services in your community during Passover, we should like them to know of the deep interest of the Jewish community of America, as expressed through your efforts and those of the Jewish Welfare Board.

It would be well if you were also to remind them that the purpose of the furlough is to give them an opportunity for religious observance of the Passover - at Seders and at services in the synagogue. They will be free and on their own responsibility while on leave. We have confidence that they will utilize the privilege of freedom from military duty in a manner that is faithful to Jewish religious traditions and that will enhance the good name of the Jew.

I know we may count on your help to see to it that the men have the opportunity to spend the holiday in this spirit.
