**PERSECUTION OF JEWS IN RUSSIA.**—In an interesting article on Russia, in a recent number of *Chambers' Journal*, we find this melancholy paragraph: "Another sad spectacle were the convoys of Jewish children who are taken away from their homes in Poland at the age of ten or twelve, carried to Archangel, to bring up as soldiers or sailors, and taught to forget the religions and customs of their fathers. It was heartrending to see these poor children, their heads shaved, driven before the rough soldiers and dying on the road of hunger and cold."

**AGRICULTURAL COLONY IN SYRIA.**—The Universal Israelitish Alliance has decided on opening a school at Beyrout. Monsieur Netter has succeeded in obtaining a grant of land in Syria, through the kind intervention of Redschid Pacha.

**ALEPPO.**—We learn from the *Univers Israelite* that Monsieur Moses de Picciotto, consul general of Austria, at Aleppo, has been decorated with the order of Francis Joseph.

**THE BLOOD ACCUSATIONS.**—An attempt having been made and echoed by two journals (one Armenian and the other Turkish), to revive the foul blood-accusation against the Jews, the government has taken immediate precautions to prevent the spread of this wicked allegation, and has at once adopted measures to protect the Jews.—*Univers Israelite*.

**THE KARAITES.**—A Jewish charitable institution has been established at St. Petersburg, for the relief of the way-faring, or stranger poor of our community. The Karaito Jews have forwarded a donation to this institution, with a graceful letter.—*Wochen-Schrift*.

**THE HUNGARIAN JEWISH CONGRESS.**—In the Hungarian diet, says the *Jewish Chronicle*, Monsieur Deak proposed the adjournment of the practical execution of the resolutions adopted by the Jewish Congress—and the proposal for such adjournment was unanimously adopted.
