

We the undersigned Executive Committee appointed by the Association for free distribution of Matzot to the poor with power to make all arrangements, and to carry out the design of said association beg leave to report as follows.

The committee contracted with Messrs R G Anderson and Mark Orace to deliver Matzot to the order of their Chairman at the rate of $4\frac{3}{4}$ Cts per lb. this being the lowest offered.

The number of orders issued by the Chairman is 665, ^{of which} 15 were returned by the Committee of inquiry and 10 ^{presented} not ~~received~~ ^{at the} bakery leaving 640 orders actually served by the Contractors. X

The aggregate weight of ^{distributed} Matzot is 14330 lbs.
of meal 20 Cts

The average weight allowed to each individual was 5 lbs ^{per person} in a family of more than 4. To single persons or where the family consisted of two or three an average of 6 or 7 lbs was allowed.

Three sessions were held at the Synagogue of the R K Shearay Shamayunt ^{Albany Street} for the distribution of orders to applicants but for those who were recommended by the ~~Executive~~ ^{Executive} ~~Committee~~ ^{Committee} or other members of the association, ^{or other reliable persons} orders were prepared by the ~~Committee~~ ^{Committee} transmitted without a personal call before the Committee at the place of distribution.

The limited time allowed to the committee for their labor did not admit of a too strict inquiry into the needs and claims of applicants, nor are they able to give a correct estimate of the number of persons comprised in the families represented by the 640 orders issued, owing to the neglect of some of the gentlemen who asked for orders without furnishing particulars. In some instances the orders issued by the chairman were transferred to other parties ~~either~~ by members of the association without consulting the chairman who alone was authorized to draw the orders. In every instance of personal application the names of husbands and wives and number of children have been duly registered. Allowing however an average of 5 lbs ~~benefit~~ ^{benefit} ~~from~~ it would appear that 2866 persons have been assisted with Matzot by the Association.

The limited time allowed to the Commr did not admit of a too close inquiry into the merits & claims of applicants nor was it possible to give a correct ^{statement of} number of persons comprised in the ~~the~~ families represented by the 600 orders issued but allowing an average of 500 to each person - amount will be 300,000. It would appear that 2066 ^{individuals} persons have been benefited by the association.
