

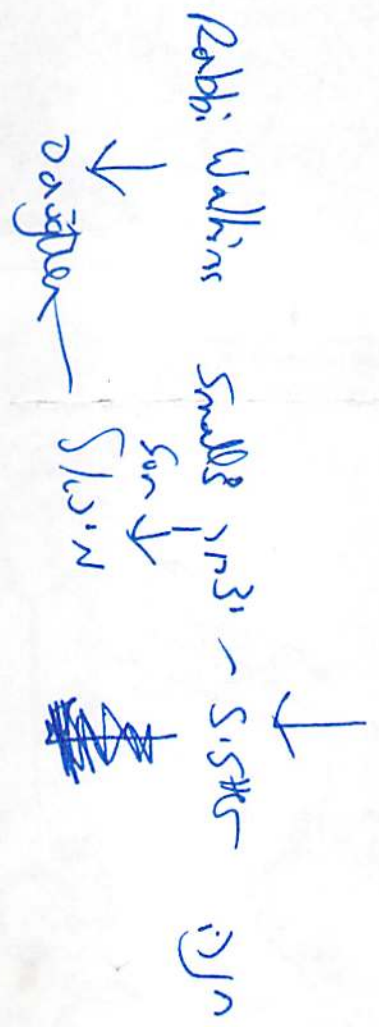

MATZOS FOR THE JEWS OF BERLIN

After a decade during which matzos and all Jewish religious ceremonials were banned by Nazi decree, the surviving Jews of Berlin and nearby cities will have home baked matzos. This is a scene in the Sarotti-Fabrik Bakery in Berlin, which will provide 85,000 pounds of unleavened bread this Passover. The packages of matzos are stacked all along the walls of the bakery in preparation. The "Joint" on the package refers to the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, the agency which is purchasing the matzos and distributing them to Jews in Berlin.

PROVIDING MATZOS FOR THE JEWS OF BERLIN

The sign on the package of matzos reads "Joint." This is what the Jews of Europe call the American Joint Distribution Committee, the agency which provides relief and rehabilitation to suffering Jews overseas. This Passover the J. D. C. will furnish more than 2,000,000 pounds of matzos and other holy day foods for the survivors overseas. This particular shipment had been baked in Berlin where matzos making was banned by an official edict for ten years. Now the baking of unleavened bread has been resumed through J. D. C. arrangements. The entire output of the factory, 85,000 pounds has been purchased by the J. D. C. and will be distributed to the Jews in Berlin and nearby towns.

BAKING MATZOS IN BERLIN

This man is helping to bake the first matzos in Berlin forbidden during Hitler's rise in power. The Joint Distribution Committee, major American relief agency for the relief and rehabilitation of Jewish survivors overseas, arranged for the baking of more than 85,000 pounds of these matzos in the Sarotti-Fabrik bakery in Berlin in time for distribution by J. D. C. field workers to Jews in the Berlin area. Additionally, the J. D. C. purchased and shipped more than 2,000,000 pounds of Passover supplies to distressed Jews throughout Europe, the Near East and as far away as Shanghai.

BERLIN PREPARES FOR PASSOVER

The first matzoths to be baked in Berlin in a decade are being prepared in the Sarotti-Fabrik factory. The Joint Distribution Committee, major American agency for the relief and rehabilitation of Jewish survivors overseas, arranged for the baking of 85,000 pounds in this bakery. Mr. S. Jacobi, the owner of the factory whose family have been matzoths bakers for five generations and who escaped death at the hands of the Nazis by living in hiding throughout the war years, is personally superintending the baking. The matzoths have been purchased by the J.D.C. and will be distributed by its representatives to the survivors in the Berlin area as part of its program of supplying 2,000,000 pounds of Passover foods to suffering Jews overseas.

THE FIRST PASSOVER AFTER LIBERATION

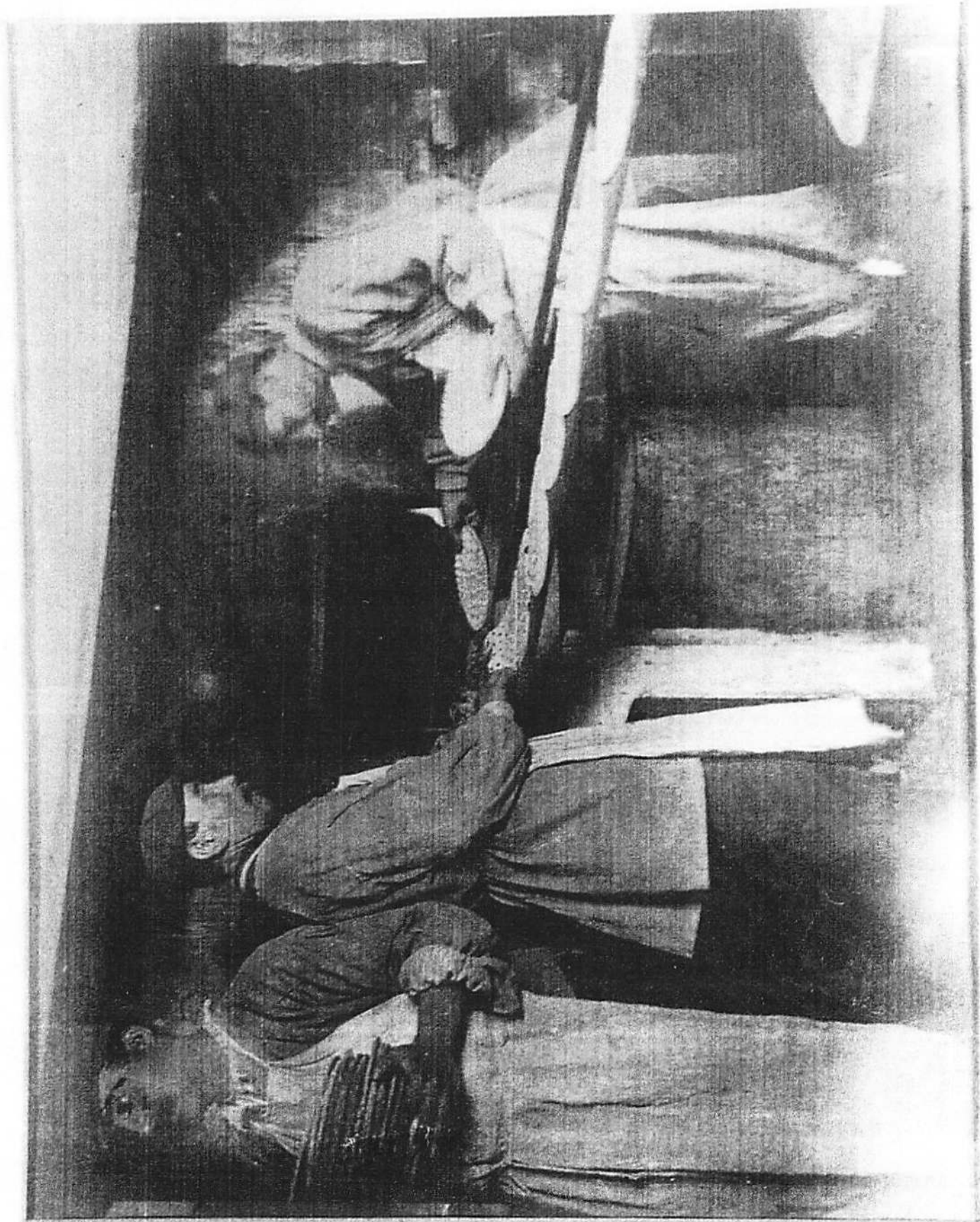
In an effort to give meaning to the first Passover spent in freedom after a decade of Nazi terror and enslavement, the Joint Distribution Committee is furnishing more than 2,000,000 pounds of matzos to Jewish survivors overseas. Here are two Jewish girls in Berlin who have triumphantly assisted in baking thousands of pounds of matzos in the Sarotti-Fabrik bakery in Berlin. This factory was closed for ten years by official edict. Now it is open again through arrangements made by the J. D. C. Its goal is 85,000 pounds by Passover. These matzos have been purchased by the J. D. C. for distribution in Berlin and nearby communities as part of its world-wide plan to give meaning to this first Passover after liberation.

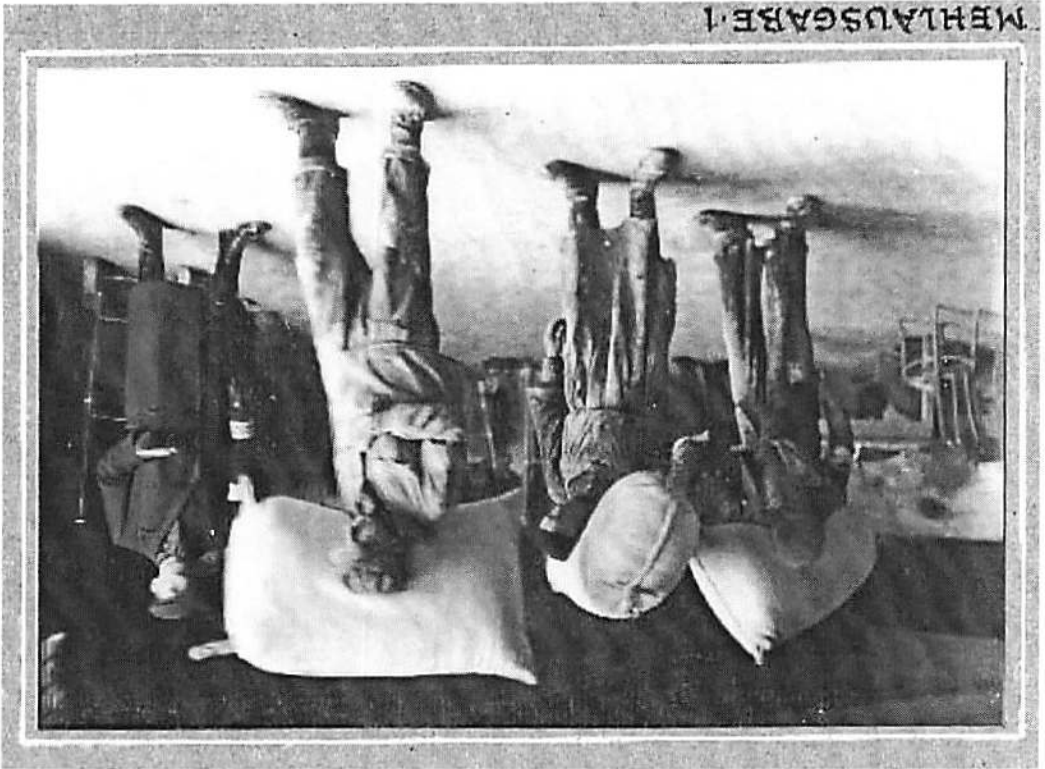


