Passover Relief.

THE Committee of the above Institution, in appealing for help for the Passover Relief with which the winter distributions have custemarily closed, feel it their duty to lay before the public the following brief summary of the work done this winter. The Kitchen was opened on 11th December, 1891, and closed on she 18th March, 1892.

In the winter of 1890-1891, the Appeal for Special Extra Nights was largely responded to, but during the last winter the Committee have only been enabled to give few extra distributions.

The demand for relief on the committee of the MIE Committee of the above Institu-

The demand for relief on the ordinary nights has however been largely in excess of

nights has however been largely in excess of that on any previous year: over 125,000 portions of bread and soup have been given away, and nearly 1,100 families have been continuously relieved during the season.

Though the winter has not been exceptionally revere, the suffering and misery have been great. The suckness prevailing generally in London has fallen terribly on those who are ill-nourished, ill-housed, and poorly clothed; those who have been stricken with influenza know how necessary good food and general warmth are during the period of recovery.

general warmth are during the period of recovery.

The recent severe weather and the high price of coals are both a very severe strain on the resources of our poor. The featival of Passover occurring during the middle of the week deprives them also of several working days, and thus the Committee feel that this year especially, the Passover Relief Fund, will be welcomed by them as it has been rarely welcomed before. They therefore appeal confidently to the public for assistance, so that the Passover may be to the poor really a period of gladness and joy, for indeed our poor are like their forefathers in Egypt, "They cannot tarry, and have made no provision for themselves."
