Zionist Organization, the leader was acclaimed by a distinguished throng of the leaders of American Jewry. The occasion, to which Senator Selden P. Spencer of Missouri came as representative of the Washington Administration marked the opening of the \$2,000,000 campaign for the Palestine Foundation Fund in Greater New York. Another feature which gave the function added significance and importance was the presence of Leslie Craigie, First Secretary of the British Embassy in Washington who brought greetings of cordial good-will from the British Government.

The chairman of the banquet, Judge Bernard A. Rosenblatt, called attention to the momentous importance at the present juncture in the history of the Jewish people and emphasized the great need of finding a Homeland for the many thousands of Jewish refugees whom the governments of Europe drive from pillar to post in the lands of oppression.

Louis Marshall, who spoke as "one who is not a Zionist," urged unity in the work of reconstructing Palestine and declared that no one should remain indifferent to what is being done in the upbuilding of the Holy Land.

"There has been enough oratory," he said, "and the time for constructive work has now arrived. Acts are the things that count and we must all now feel that it is our duty to sink all differences and work together that our dreams may be fulfilled and our enemies undone and all controversies cease in the doing of the thing that must be done. I hope there shall be a perfect union among the Jews of the United States in helping the cause of Palestine.

"There must be no politics, there must be only the cause that calls for support. You who are Zionists and we who are not should work shoulder to shoulder for Palestine."

Dr. Weizmann, when he arose, was received with an enthusiastic demonstration of applause and cheers. He reported on the progress which he found had been made in the development of Jewish life in every field of activity in Palestine and dwelt at length on the close relation between the Jewish America and Jewish Palestine, urging that the success of the second depended upon the understanding and generosity of the first. He expressed profound optimism in the outcome of the Jewish effort, saying that with the spirit which the *Chaluzim* were manifesting in Palestine it was impossible for the Jews to fail.

"Just as a stricken European world turns its eyes to the mighty Republic of the West as a great bulwark of civilization, exactly in the same way do the Jewish communities of Europe look to American Jewry for moral and material support in the upbuilding of Jewish life in Palestine," Dr. Weizmann declared.

"At one time the Jewish communities of Europe gave both men and money to the Zionist movement. Now with very few exceptions, these communities have been shattered by the great convulsion of the war and their reconstruction is retarded by the slow and clumsy working of the political machinery of Europe. The countries with large Jewish populations are mostly those in which the exchange and currency have greatly deteriorated. In one sense they are even a source of momentary embarrassment in the upbuilding of Palestine because they throw off a big stream of immigrants who exercise a heavy pressure on the

the contribution made by America as a whole in the expressions of sympathy laid down by the resolutions of the American Senate and Congress in favor of the Jewish National Home in Palestine.

"Step by step the Jewish revival of Palestine restores the hope of a stable relationship between east and west. The work of rebuilding Palestine calls for large sacrifices of money on the part of American Jewry. The present campaign of the Palestine Foundation Fund is in line with the world task of Palestine reconstruction. I am confident that American Jewry will respond in the future even more generously than in the past."

A letter from Sir Alfred Mond, a member of the Lloyd George Cabinet, who is Honorary Chairman of the Keren Hayesod in Great Britain, was read in which he said he may visit America this fall to discuss Zionist problems. He wrote in part:

"American Jewry has already made splendid responses to the appeals for support of the National Home, but this is a time for a special effort. While it is to be hoped that conditions there will improve as time progresses, in the interval a great burden and responsibility, but also a great privilege, rests on the shoulders of American Jewry. In spite of all difficulties and of all attacks and discouragements the progress of the National Home is proceeding all the time. The more it can be quickened and hastened by the necessary financial support the sooner will it become, as it should ultimately do, a self-supporting proposition.

"The ideal of the Keren Hayesod was a great one, and under all the circumstances and difficulties the results attained, although far short of what
