### BLOOD ACCUSATIONS.

(the fast of Esther), a special public service was held at the temporary synagogue, which was attended by the whole congregation. The reader recited the prayer *הזכרת נשמה* for the repose of the soul of the late Emperor, and the Rabbi, Dr. Drabkin, delivered an impressive elegy—*הספד*. Our contemporary also states that from that day till the funeral, the *הזכרת נשמה* will be read daily morning and evening.
